An entrepreneur gathers the resources needed to produce and sell that good or service in a community, state, or region. Some examples of entrepreneurs include the person who operates a hair salon, the owner of a coffee shop that sells bagels and ice cream, or the owner/operator of a lawn care and garden maintenance service. It would also include the inventors and owners of factories that produce such things as clothing, machinery, or electronics.
