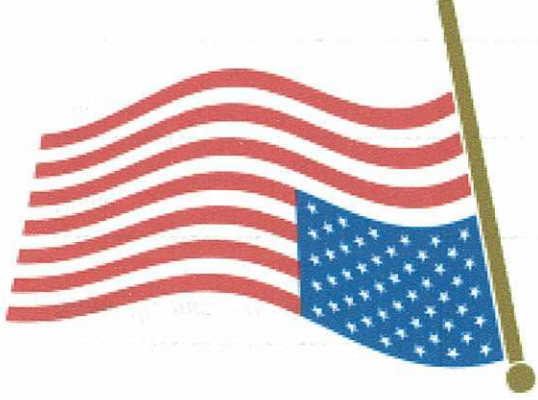
New Pennsylvania Puzzle

A Piece of the Puzzle is classroom tested and has shown to foster excitement in the learning process. A Piece of the Puzzle is an innovative game to promote the learning of historical facts and terms in a fun and meaningful process. Two different magnetic puzzles are presented in an attractive sturdy tin. Question cards are enclosed, which ask questions about a particular period of history which the puzzle depicts. One student acts as monitor and reads the questions on the cards. Students alternate with questions. If the student answers correctly, they receive a piece of their puzzle. One piece of the puzzle for each correct answer. Questions are given to students until all pieces of the puzzle are distributed and puzzles are assembled. The first to complete their puzzle now becomes the monitor and the game begins again.
