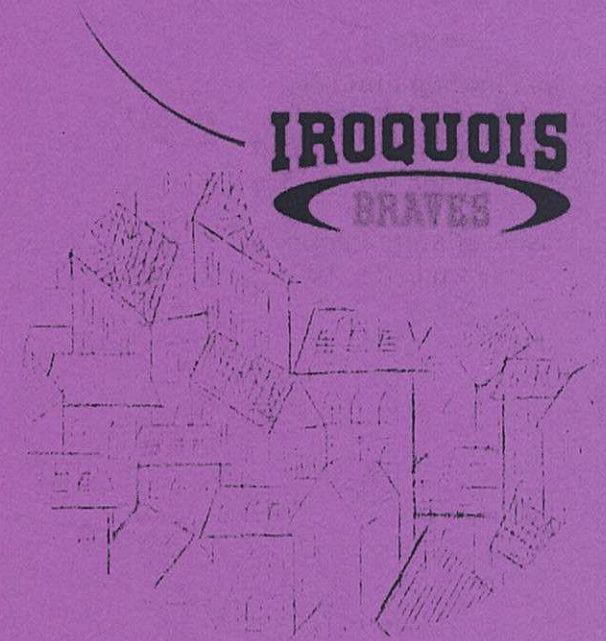

Sessions for Everyone

School Funding and Local Taxes, Mr. Shane Murray, Library: Schools cost a lot of money to run! Attend this session to see where tax money is spent.
