

When we are done making the game it is put in a Zip-Loc baggy and can be carried anywhere.

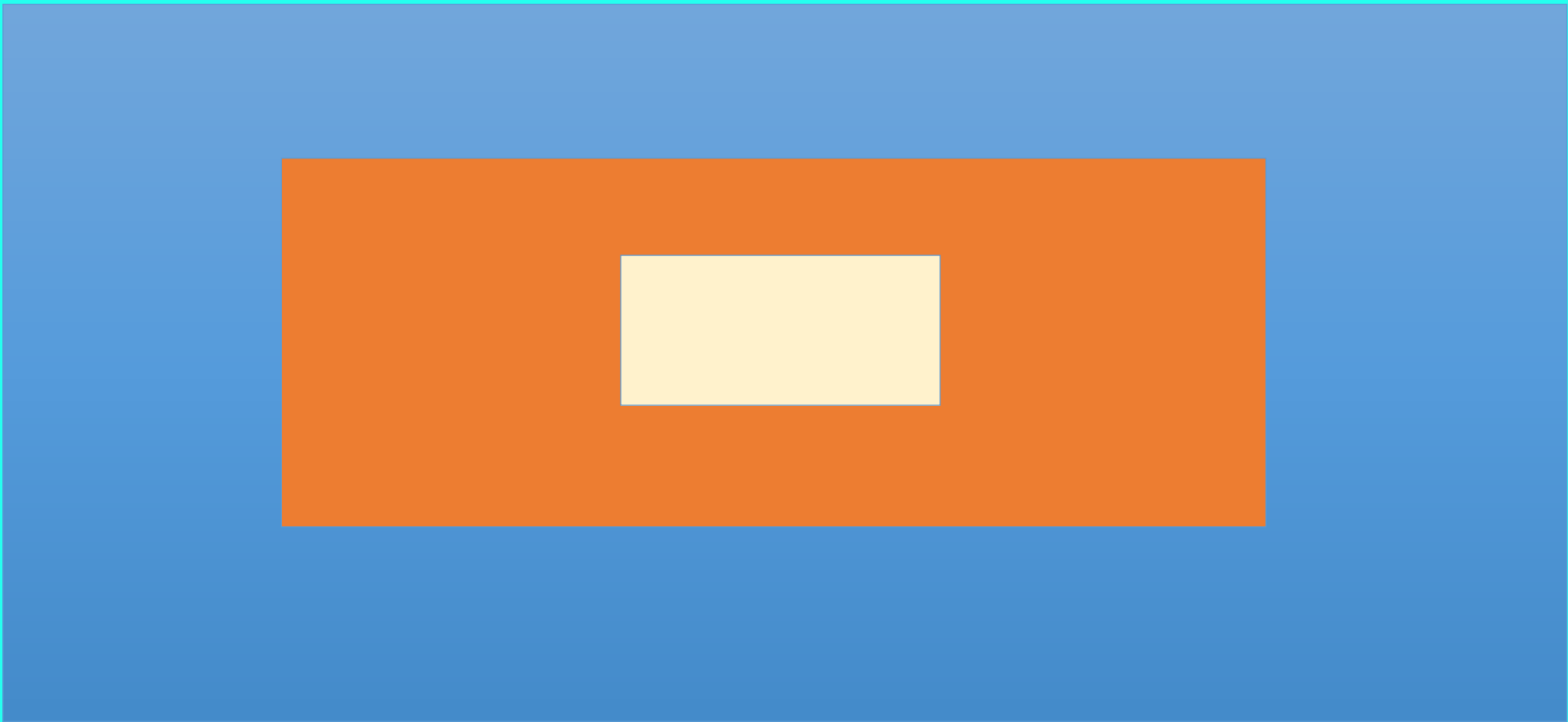
The baggy will have a complete game and the rules.

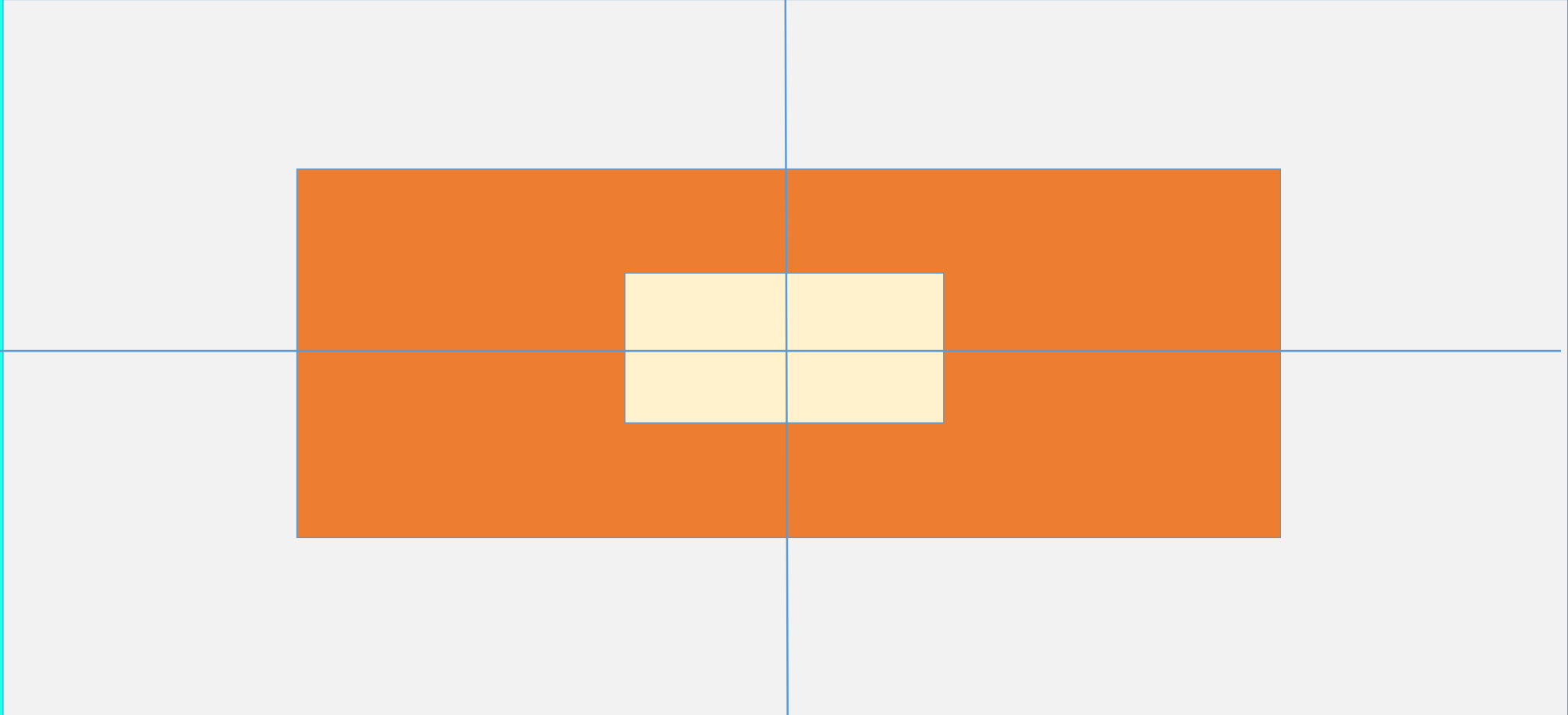
Items everyone needs:

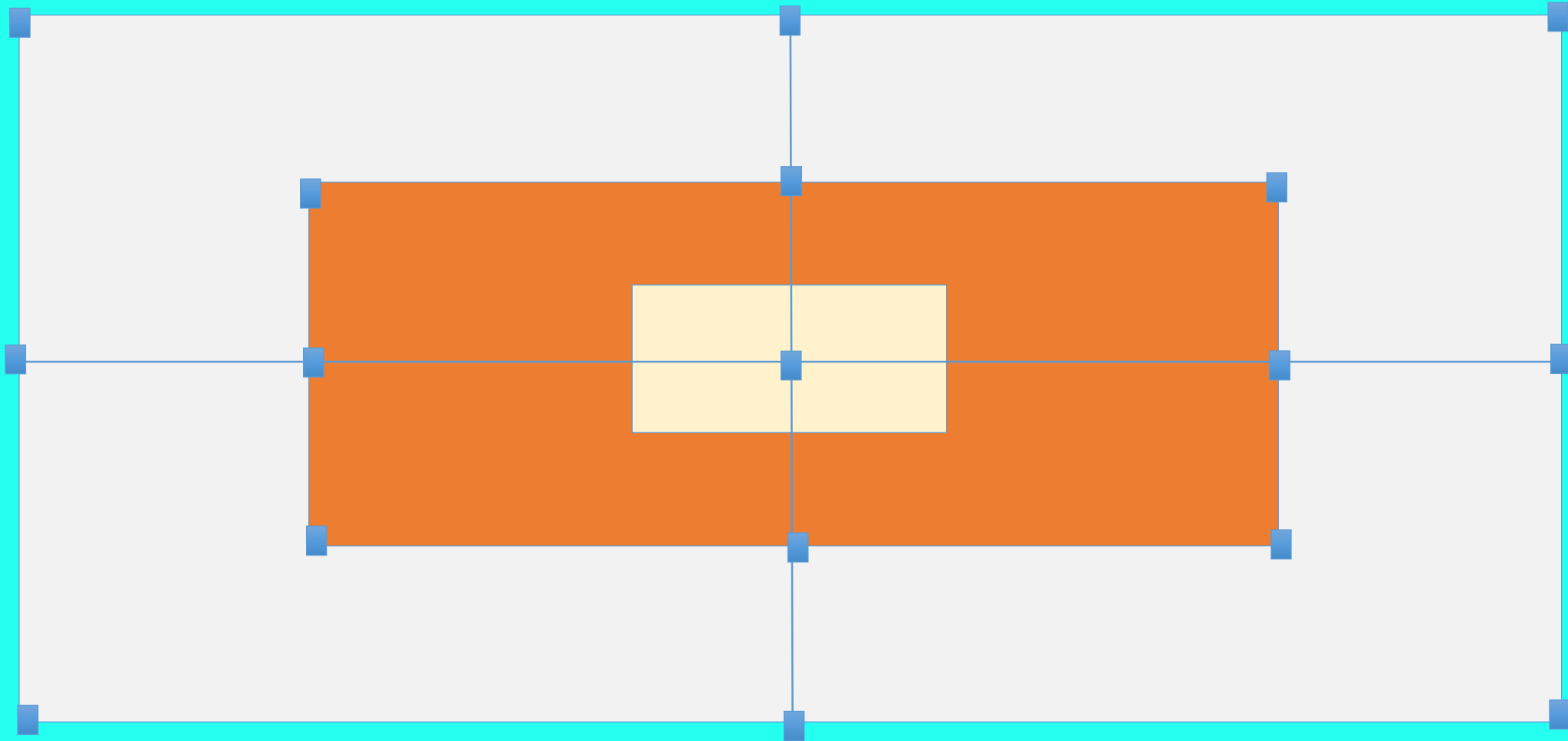
1. Piece of felt
