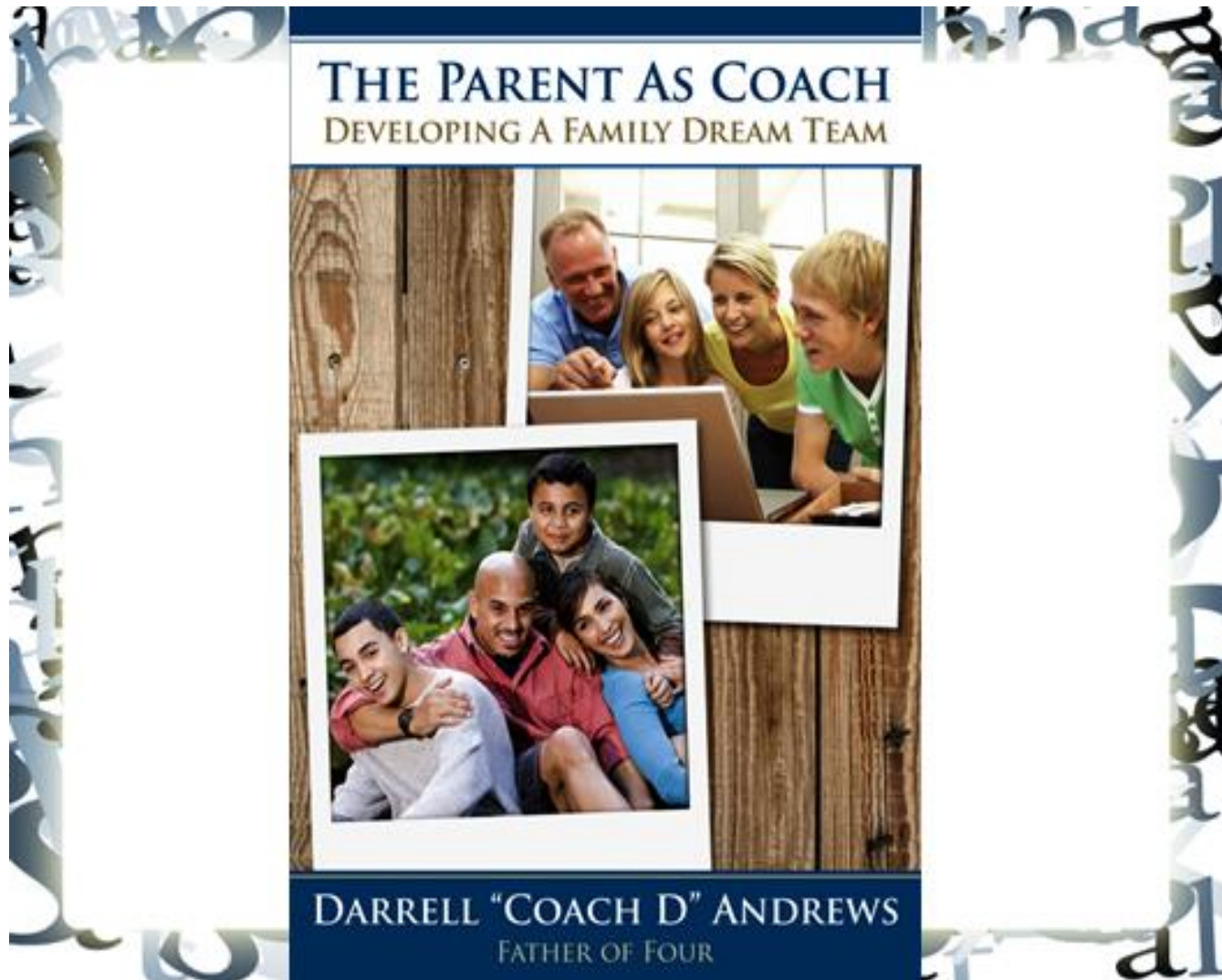

Goals

Goal setting 101:

- Challenging but realistic
- Attainable
- Specific
- Measurable
- Personal and family oriented
- Timetable – long term(5-10 yrs.) mid term (2-3 years) – short term (6 mos.-1 year)

Plan

“A goal without a plan is just a wish”

A plan gives specific details of what you are going to do to accomplish the goal.

- What does it cost?
- How are am I going to save the money?
- What must I do monthly, weekly, daily to achieve my goal?
- Who else must be involved?
- What tools or equipment will I need?
- Etc...

(write down a specific plan for 1 goal)

Support

- Get the training necessary
- Research
- Be a part of the program or process
- Encourage
- Make it possible

Evaluate

- Is it working?
- If not, why?
- Is it the plan or the execution of the plan?
- Adjust accordingly!
